We would like to provide you with some background on the member this scholarship is named after:

Washington County Sheriff's Office Senior Investigator Bruce H. Hamilton, graduated from Salem Washington Academy and started his career with the Washington County Sheriff's Office as a Deputy Sheriff on May 7th, 1987. He was promoted to Sergeant August 1995, Investigator September 1998 and Senior Investigator August 2013. During his career with the Sheriff's Office Senior Investigator Hamilton served in many capacities to include Accident Reconstruction Supervisor, Juvenile Investigator, and DCIS and Homeland security liaison. Bruce was instrumental in the modernization of the department, and in the implementation of multiple law enforcement programs to enhance the services provided to the community.

Senior Investigator Hamilton was the lead investigator on multiple homicide and fatal motor vehicle investigations during his career. His diligence, attention to detail, and genuine dedication to the victims and their families resulted in the successful prosecution of offenders.

Bruce was an exceptionally dedicated officer, strong victim advocate, a mentor, and a friend to anyone in need.

August 2014 the Washington County Sheriff's office added a new K9 to its department. K-9 Brucha a female German Shepherd was named in honor of Sr. Investigator Hamilton. The name Brucha was chosen as a representation of Bruce's name. The name Brucha represents decent people with a sense of Justice, lovers of Justice & honesty with a need to prove themselves & will do everything to succeed.

Fitting for what Bruce stood for in life.

In February 2024 K9 Brucha retired from the Sheriff's office but sadly passed away as short time later surrounded by her loving family.
